
There are lots of ways you can enhance your child's learning at home!





Here is a range of things you could do at home. If your child would like to share anything they have done, please photograph the outcome and email it to the school office.

Children could explore the BBC Bitesize website to learn about light and forces. Then they could experiment with magnets and discover what materials are magnetic at home.

Children could explore a range of Roald Dahl stories and films.

Walk around your local community and explore the natural and manmade features. Children might like to get out and about exploring the natural surroundings.

You could look at OS maps and road atlases and become more aware of how neighbouring communities are linked. They could create their own maps showing places they enjoy visiting in their community, and their walk to school.

Children could find local Somerset recipes, have a go at cooking them at home and tell the class about it back at school.

You could also find out about Hindu gods and goddesses.
