There are lots of ways you can enhance your child's learning at home!

Play some familiar board games.

Visit your local library and look at any information books on toys or the Moon landings.

Research information on the internet and talk to any grandparents who may recall watching men land on the moon. Make a scrap book or a rocket made from scrap materials.


Find out any information about Tim Peake and his space mission.
