## Objectives for 2016-2017:

- To increase our community sports links with local clubs from 3 to 6. *This has been achieved.*
- To assess impact of Real PE delivery on teacher confidence & physical literacy attainment. Teacher feedback on the resource is that it has given them more confidence to lead PE sessions and it has enabled them to observe physical progress of the children and the children have been able to assess and evaluate their own progress.
- This year we had 72% of children attend a school club. Next year we aim to provide sports/healthy lifestyle clubs so that we achieve 100% attendance of pupils. 92% attended school clubs so this will be a focus next year to hit the 100% target.
- To incorporate cooking into the curriculum focusing on skills and nutritious and healthy eating. *Initial implementation of this target* stalled as our new kitchen area was not fit for purpose. This will be reviewed for next year.
