Amber –Enhanced

More than 5 who have mixed closely, test positive for Covid -19 within a 10-day period

Evidence of established transmission within the setting. There are multiple groups that meet additional threshold

Contact SCC PH Team to complete a risk assessment and consider the use of enhanced outbreak control measures:

AMBER CONTROL MEASURES

- Increased frequency of LFD testing for staff where there is high prevalence
- Promoting social distancing to reduce crowding and intergroup mixing. This may include reducing the number of children gathering:

If more than 5 cases are identified in any class:

- Identified class/es not to attend whole school collective worship or presentations/workshops in the hall
- move collective worship activities for all classes outdoors where possible.

If this is not possible:

- Stagger collective worship sessions for all classes to limit the number of classes attending at one time
- Identified class/es to eat lunch in a separate room
- Identified class/es to have break at separate times to other classes to avoid contact with other children
- Identified class/es to use toilet at separate times and toilets to be cleaned afterwards.

If advised by PH to do so:

- Identified class/es to arrange tables in front facing rows
- Reduce mixing of staff by holding meetings virtually
- Limitation of residential educational visits, open days, transition, and taster days. Live performances and parental attendance
- Daily LFD testing for close contacts for 7 days (aged 5+) subject to PH risk assessment
- Recommend a one-off PCR test for setting contacts, subject to PH risk assessment
- Reintroduction of face coverings in classrooms and communal areas, **subject to PH risk** assessment

Comms: School issues revised warn and inform letter to identified group.

Red – Exceptional

Exceptional measures required to break within setting transmission.

Ongoing established transmission

Joint risk assessment education and public health, via OCT

RED CONTROL MEASURES

• Attendance restrictions

Comms: via OCT minutes LA education SCC PH and PHE RSC. Letter to whole school community.

Additional Considerations

Please note the following considerations, should attendance be restricted for any reason:

Remote Learning:

High-quality remote learning in schools, further education and higher education settings should be provided for all pupils and students if:

- They have tested positive for COVID-19 but are well enough to learn from home; or
- Attendance at their setting has been temporarily restricted

Safeguarding measures:

- Review child protection policy to make sure it reflects any local restrictions and remains effective.
- Aim to have a trained DSL or deputy DSL on site wherever possible.

Adapt as necessary according to the arrangements you have in place

• If the DSL (or deputy) can't be on site, they can be contacted remotely.
