#### What have we been up to?

ACEarts came to carry out two whole day workshops for the Year 3 children based on our summer term theme Story Tellers. The children made tunnel books and pop up books creating stories without words, both on animal themes, which they then told each other. This is an inter-generational project with Wessex House, both ends of the generation spectrum are creating books which will be shared at a joint end of term celebration. The books are then to be put into suitcases to tour Somerset venues. The books will first be on show as a gallery exhibition in September 2019 upstairs in the ACEarts gallery.

Year 6 took part in a week long residential trip to London earlier this month.
