Our Learning Journey





We launched our topic by exploring at our own 'Grand Design' — our new school building. We found out about King Ina, who was an ancient King of Wessex, and looked at our amazing school stained-glass window. We sketched it and then created our own stained-glass window design.



Throughout this exciting topic, Sparrowhawks will have the opportunity to explore a range of grand designs, with the majority of our work centred around the inspiring structure of cathedrals, both local and further afield.



We will start with developing our sketching techniques to draw detailed drawings of Wells Cathedral whilst exploring some of the key design features. As we move on through the term, we will create illuminated letters, use clay to model our own designs of gargoyles and chimeras and create our own stained glass windows that depict a story. Once we have explored man-made grand designs, we will discover some amazing grand designs in nature.
