

Home learning with your child in another language

Use your strongest language to boost your child's home learning!



- ✓ Get your child to explain the task in your home language.
- ✓ Talk about the topic together in your home language.
- ✓ Ask questions about the work in your home language e.g. How does that work? What do we have to do? How do you know that?
- ✓ Explain the concepts in your home language.
- ✓ Make notes or draft a piece of work together in your home language.
- ✓ Do a home language version of the work.
- Use a bilingual dictionary / online translator. If it is a Microsoft Word document, highlight the text and use the translate function (under Review tab). Or under View, select Immersive Reader to have it read aloud to you.
- ✓ Contact your child's teacher if you don't understand the work.
- ✓ Join / set up a WhatsApp, Face Book or other social media group with other parents, especially a group with parents who speak the same home language.



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- ✓ Watch BBC iPlayer programmes with English subtitles on.
- ✓ Read together in your home language. Try these websites for texts: Global
