


There are lots of ways you can enhance your child's learning at home!

What else will we be learning about this term?

We have been really looking forward to our 'Storytelling' Topic as it takes place during our creative term, and we will be exploring and telling stories through many mediums; from writing and drawing to music, painting and drama.

In Science, Year 4 will be studying States of Matter, including comparing and grouping materials according to whether they are solid, liquids or gases, and looking at the processes of evaporation and condensation. Year 5 will be studying Animals, including humans, looking at the changes in humans as they develop to old age.

In PE, we will be studying Cricket and Rounders; practising the skills of striking, catching, hitting and throwing involved in these games. We will also be focusing on improving our ability in running, jumping and throwing in athletics.

Our RE Topic this term is exploring 'What it's like to be a Christian', asking questions about Christian beliefs and studying Christian life.



Our Learning Journey

We launched our Storytelling topic by attending different workshops with each class teacher, where we explored how to create, write and tell stories in creative and fun ways.

Some Topic focuses include:

- Studying 'Peter & The Wolf', looking at the power of music in storytelling and how we can create the same effect with our own stories and music;
- Illustrating a well-known story using comic strip illustrations, paintings and collages.
- Writing and/or performing plays to re-tell a well-known fairy tale.
- Exploring language by writing and illustrating our own riddles.
- Creating stories from set but imaginative criteria.
- Create, illustrate and perform poetry.

'Storytelling' will culminate in one of our topic outcome days on Wednesday 10th July, when we hope to hold a storytelling festival. Parents and other classes will be invited to view and enjoy our work from across the term!
