There are lots of ways you can enhance your child's learning at home!





You could research any interesting aspect of Tudor life and create a fact poster or create a model of a Tudor building from lego or other materials.

You may sew your own Tudor sampler, or make your own board game about the Tudors. Perhaps you'd like to research and design a Tudor outfit, labelling it clearly.

You could explore Tudor recipes and do some cooking together, then record your recipe to share with the class.

You could do your own family tree and compare it to that of the Tudors.

Watch any relevant television programmes including Horrible Histories or any suitable BBC documentaries.

Visit Somerton library and explore their collection of Tudor non-fiction books. The library needs our support.

You could visit Tudor buildings or sites of interest and then produce a visitor's report with interesting details and pictures to share back in class.

Start researching and gathering items of clothing to create your Tudor costume for the topic outcome day. No need to buy something new from the internet — just be creative with what you have already.

During the term Peregrines will be discovering who the Tudors were, familiarizing themselves with the Tudor monarchs.




